DCC considered the above requests from K. Tejaswini and Aditya Sonker who have passed in all the courses except one theory course ('F' grade) and the Seminar (1 Cr) which they have not credited yet. These students could not register for the Seminar course in the odd semester, when it was offered, as that would lead them to credit overload (maximum credit limit is 28 credits in the 7th semester, as per the Institute regulations). In the even semester as the course was not offered, they could not credit the course even when they had sufficient credits free. Both these students have completed 6 years of study and would need further extension for completing the course if contact course is not permitted. Considering the above circumstances, DCC decided to recommend the requests as a special case, for consideration by the BOAC and the Senate.
