Minutes of the DCC Meeting on 19th April 2017 (Wednesday)

The meeting started at 11.00 am. Dr. Saidalavy Kalady, HOD, CSED welcomed the members to the DCC meeting. The Agenda of the meeting was to discuss the new PG curriculum to be proposed

1. DCC entrusted the job of preparing the draft curriculum for M.Tech (CS) and M.Tech(IS) to Dr. Priya Chandran. She will be assisted by Dr. Saleena to prepare the curriculum for M.Tech (CS) and Dr. Jimmy Jose to prepare for M.Tech (IS).
2. DCC discussed the division of 60 credits between two years for M.Tech programme. Dr.Priya Chandran proposed the following scheme for credit distribution

Semester -1 – 16 Credits (4 Courses 4 Credit each)

Semester -2 – 16 Credits (4 Courses 4 Credit each)

Semester -3 – 14 Credits (10 Credit Project + 4 Credit Elective/ Term Paper)














Semester -4 – 14 Credits (Project)

In the above schemes it was recommended that Term Paper be made a core subject. Students are provided with the flexibility of taking it either in Semester 2 or in Semester 3. It will be advantageous for the student to take the term paper in second semester from which he/she can evolve his/her final year thesis area. For those students who are planning to do internship outside, they can do the elective in semester 2 and term paper in semester 3 with their internal guide along with their project.

3. DCC recommended limiting of maximum number of projects guided by a faculty to be 3 for M.Tech and 4 for MCA.

4. DCC discussed about the grading policy for S8 BTech Projects. Dr. Vineeth Kumar suggested that across the panels it should be made a practice if the members of the group is not able to answer any top level question about the content of the report submitted, they should not be awarded S, A or B. Panel will decide on the grade of the group and guide can distribute the grade among the members of the group. The maximum grade that can be assigned to an individual member is grade assigned by the panel.
