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<b>Section 2 - Items For Consideration and Approval</b>	
<b>Subject FC.58.03</b>	<b>Consideration of the proposal for establishing “Optics and Photonics Workshop” in the Department of Physics:</b>
	<p>It was apprised by the Director to the Board of Governors that Optical instruments are widely employed in various fields and industrial applications, such as communication, manufacturing industry, microscopy, medicine, astronomy, material characterization, pollution detection, etc. Their applications ranges from day-to-day uses such as lenses, bar-code readers, remote controllers, etc. to high-end applications in medicine (diagnostics to treatment).</p> <p>However, the existing curriculum is not sufficient to meet the industry/research demands in terms of providing comprehensive and practical understanding of the optical instrumentation.</p>

To bridge this gap, during the curriculum revision of B.Tech. Engineering Physics, we have introduced a new course named “Optics and Photonics Worksop (PH4034E)”.

This course is dedicated to provide hands-on training on various basic optics instrumentation techniques, in addition to the existing optics lab.

The major goal of this course is to develop skilled human power in the optical instrumentation area. In specific, this course will enable the students to take up jobs/higher studies in the fields like optical microscopy, interferometry, optical techniques for flow visualizations, optical techniques for surface characterization, etc.

**Objectives:**

- To equip the students to design optical circuits based on the principles on ray optics, wave optics and electromagnetic theory
- To enable the students to design, implement and develop complex optical setups/instruments

**Proposed experiments:**

Here we present a list of experiments which could be suitable for the proposed course. The list contains two parts: Part A deals with the experiments that required to be designed and implemented by the students, and the Part B is based on measurements employing available instruments in the department/institute.

- Beam expanders/collimators – Keplerian and Galelian
- Telescope design
- Spatial frequency filtering of Gaussian beam (Fourier optics)
- Laser beam profile and polarization measurements
- Interferometric measurements
- Fringe projection technique (profilometry)
- Illumination systems - Bright-field, dark field and phase contrast concepts
- Optical microscope (Illumination, Imaging and Image processing)
- Holography and imaging techniques
- Fluorescent particle velocimetry
- Optical trapping and force measurements

**Part B**

- Surface plasmon resonance and thermo plasmonics
- IR thermal measurements
- Fiber optic measurements
- Dynamic light scattering experiment

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	<p>The Director informed that, NBA during their recent visit had commented on the lower financial powers given to HODs of NIT Calicut. Director also explained the need to increase the financial powers of Head of the Departments to 2.5 lakhs from the existing 75,000/-. Director also pointed out the scenarios of other NITs where the financial powers are equal to 2.5 lakhs for the HODs which is half of the delegated powers to Deans.</p> <p>Joint Secretary &amp; Financial Adviser had enquired whether any such instructions from Ministry is available for raising the financial powers. In reply, Director intimated that the decision to increase the financial powers are taken in the Board of Governors.</p> <p><i>Based on the above, the FC recommended to the Hon'ble BoG for approval of the proposal and increasing the financial powers of HODs to INR 2.5 lakhs and delegate financial powers to the Centre Chairpersons at par with the HODs. The FC also instructed to avoid situations where same official is holding multiple roles like Dean, HOD and/or Chairperson.</i></p>

<p><b>Decision</b></p>	<p>It was apprised to the FC that Mega Hostel -1 was proposed in the year of 2006. The work was initiated by calling Expression of Interest for selecting Architects and Project Management Consultants. Based on that Expression of Interest called for, as per the norms and due procedures, M/s. Pithavadian and Partners had been selected and were appointed as Architects and Project Management</p>

Consultant for the Mega Hostel-1 project with due approval of the Board of Governors of the Institute.

Subsequently, the process of selection of the contractor got initiated after submitting the required tender documents prepared by the consultant. Then, following all procedures, M/s. Era Infra Engineering Ltd – New Delhi was awarded the work for an amount of Rs. 88.78 Crore and for a time period of 30 months. As per this contract, the work was supposed to be completed on 15.08.2011. But due to the default of contractor including delays in labour deployment, delays in material procurement, insufficient staff, failure in planning, lack of financial abilities, etc., the project got stuck and there was an inordinate delay in the progress of the project. Time extensions were granted till November 2018 on the contractor's request (after June 2015, Penalty Clause was also imposed). Yet, they failed to execute the work. During September 2018, the contractor abandoned that site and filed a case against NIT Calicut in District Court & High Court of Kerala seeking to appoint a sole arbitrator. The court admitted the same and arbitration proceedings was commenced in March 2018. Meanwhile, the contract agreement was terminated vide termination order dated 27.03.2019 with the approval of the Board of Governors of the Institute.

Subsequently, the final measurement was taken on 27.02.2020 after getting the legal order from the Hon'ble NCLT, dated 10.01.2020. Also, it was decided to get the balance(remaining) work done by the CPWD. After necessary formalities, the site was handed over to CPWD. CPWD submitted the preliminary estimate in December 2020, and thereafter the same has been revised on July 2021. Approvals from the BWC and the BoG were taken and the work was entrusted to CPWD. But thereafter CPWD denied to take up the balance work in Mega Hostel-1, quoting legal complications and other issues. In the meantime, the arbitration award was pronounced on 14.11.2022 by the Sole arbitrator which declared judgement in favour of the Institute subsequent to the sitting held in April 2022. Then the institute resorted to alternate solutions to complete the balance work and finally proposed to sanction time extension to the existing consultant M/s. Pithavadian and Partners for completing the balance work in Mega Hostel-1.

Their agreement dated 20.02.2008 was still in force and based on that, the BWC



recommended time extension and the BoG approved the same.

The committee noted that the remaining work in the Mega Hostel-1 project is now entrusted to M/s. Pithavadian And Partners as per the BWC/BOG minutes 2022:02:14. Based on that they had submitted the Estimate and other required documents for tendering for a value of amount Rs. 15,32,06,668/- (Rupees Fifteen Crore Thirty Two Lakhs, Six Thousand, Six Hundred and Sixty Eight only). The committee also observed that the estimate was discussed in the PMC meeting held on 12-05-2023 and was approved by the PMC. The members again reviewed the estimate and noted that the items covered under the Head 'additional works' in the estimate includes firefighting work at Dining block, U.G sump & pump room, allied fittings for firefighting, Block- B (handed over building), fire alarm repair & reconditioning, data cabling and networking to all rooms, septic tank for emergency purposes, latest electrical fixtures instead of existing fittings due to non-availability/energy saving, additional pathway work in front of reception block, and providing a toilet for differently abled occupants in every floor as per the present norms. It was also noted that the specifications of these added facilities conform to the updated rules and regulations necessary for obtaining approval from government bodies. The committee noted that the abstract of the estimate along with details are as given in the following table.

The committee reiterated the point that the consultant has to arrange for getting various local authority approvals, in addition to completing the balance work on time. Committee also noted that, considering the additional works involved, the period of completion proposed i.e., 9 months, is justifiable. The committee also acknowledged that the supplemental agreement is signed on 08.06.2023. The committee also noted that the total estimate amount is Rs. 15,32,06,668/- out of which Rs. 6,54,27,323/- is for the additional work and the remaining amount of Rs. 8,77,79,345/- ( Rs. 5,20,12,136.03/- + Rs. 3,57,67,208.75/-) is to be adjusted with the risk and cost of the contractor. It was also noted that the contractor's money available with NITC against risk and cost is Rs. 7,96,40,555/-. Representative from MoE pointed out that the contractor's money available with institute is slightly less than the amount expected under risk and cost. In reply, the Dean (P&D), NITC, clarified that the amount of balance work under risk and cost of the contractor is only the estimate and with a high probability the actual cost will come within the contractor's money available with the Institute.

***The FC noted that the BWC deliberated over the estimate and other points of discussion, including the revised time of completion and recommended the approval of estimate of Rs 15,32,06,668/- for the balance work of Mega Hostel- I.***

***It was also recommended that out of the total estimate, Rs. 6,54,27,323/- is for the additional work which is highly essential for making the building functional. Accordingly, it was recommended to sanction the amount of Rs. 6,54,27,323/- from OH-35. It was recommended that the estimated cost of Rs. 8,77,79,345/- for the balance items and damaged items is to be adjusted with the contractor's money of Rs. 7,96,40,555/-. Available with NITC against the risk and cost.***

***The committee noted the revised time of completion within a period of 9 months (i.e., on or before 8<sup>th</sup> March 2024) for the project and reiterated that consultant has to arrange for getting various local authority approvals while completing the balance work on time.***

During the rainy season there are repeated repair requests because of the cropping up of leak related issues. So, it is proposed to replace the galvalume sheet by GI Trafford sheets. <b>Decision</b>	<p>The committee noted that the Department of Architecture and Planning is one of the highly recognized departments of NIT Calicut. The department has been ranked in the second position in Architecture in the recent NIRF rankings, maintaining their previous year's rank. The department offers undergraduate and post graduate degree programmes in Architecture and Planning. A dedicated building was provided to the department with a total area of 8700 m<sup>2</sup>. It was facilitated with drawing halls, lecture halls, faculty room, etc. Since its construction, no major maintenance work has been carried out in this building. TBI plays a significant role in social outreach and the promotion of the startup ecosystem. Under TBI, there are several facilities like Innovation and Entrepreneurship Development Centre, Centre for Transportation Research, Design Innovation Centre, Centre for Materials Characterization, Centre for Computational Modeling and Simulation, IPR Cell, etc. to provide the support for R&amp;D with thrust on innovations. Even though the focus of TBI was on Information Technology and Electronics, a second unit of TBI sanctioned under the Startup India Mission, has added new portfolios for incubation in the areas of agriculture, nanotechnology, biotechnology, and renewable energy. Out of the 77 startups registered with TBI, 52 have graduated after the due incubation period of 3 years. The committee observed that, currently, the office of TBI is in a building near to the Central Library. Redesigning of the office was proposed for facilitating improved results from TBI. A committee was constituted under the headship of the Deputy Director, NITC for looking after matters related to this. In the meeting held by the committee, it was proposed to allot a suitable space for TBI in the hostel building of School of Management Studies, NITC. The committee also recommended a two phase development of the redesign proposal in which the first phase is to shift the activities to the proposed space. The work in this phase include flooring, false ceiling, aluminium partitions, painting etc. along with reallocation of space and utilities. <p><b>Decision</b></p>	<p>The committee noted that as part of the upcoming construction of the New Academic Block building (G+6), which would be located next to the IT Lab Complex, the following preparations need to be carried out simultaneously. The estimated power requirement for the multiplex building, equipped with state-of-the-art engineering labs and hi-tech classrooms, is approximately 500 kVA. In anticipation of future expansions in the Electrical Measurement Lab area of the academic building, a 630 KVA dry-type indoor transformer with HT and LT control panels needs to be considered. Due to the periodic increase in power demand at the main campus, it is necessary to install an additional power distribution transformer at main Substation-1. This will cater to the needs of the newly proposed Students Activity and Sports Centre (G+2), the addition of extra floors to Admin BlockB, the installation of more passenger lifts in various academic buildings, and the exponential growth in power demand at the residential campus. The provision for energization of building including the requirement of substation may be entrusted to the CPWD, since the work should be parallelly executed as per the requirement of the New Academic Block. The committee noted that the proposal is to consider the cost of installation of the 630 kVA transformer including HT and LT panel along with cabling (142.00 Lakhs) as part of the amount sanctioned under EWS for the New Academic Block to be executed by CPWD. The work of installation of this transformer also may be entrusted to CPWD. <p><b>Decision</b></p>	<p>The committee noted that there was a decision by BoG, NITC (BG.64.04 dated 27-02-2023) to withdraw the project of construction of New Academic Block (under EWS scheme) which was entrusted to the CPWD. This was following the recommendation of the BWC meeting held on 24th January 2023. The factor that led to this decision was the inordinate delay in the execution for the project. Even after paying the advance amount in March 2022, the project could not be initiated after one year, and the first tender was cancelled after evaluation. The poor state of affairs with respect to workmanship, supervision and time of completion of several of the ongoing projects by CPWD in the campus also added to this decision. It was also decided to proceed with the project by calling Expression of Interest (EoI) along with other proposed major projects of the Institute. Subsequently, the CPWD was requested to refund the advance deposit amount of Rs. 7.44 Cr. without delay. Later, the Special Director General (SDG), CPWD, Chennai (vide letter dated 24-03-2023) requested the Secretary, Dept. of Higher Education, MoE, Govt. of India, to intervene in this matter to retain the project with CPWD. In the letter, it was mentioned that the tenders received on recall turned out to be very competitive, and it would be highly beneficial for the Institute to proceed with the same. Subsequently, the SDG talked to the Director of the Institute and reviewed the matter. <p><b>Decision</b></p>	<p>The committee noticed that the BoG vide BG.63.03 dated 05/12/2022 had approved a grant amount of 460 lakhs for setting up a 33 kV substation and for providing 11 kV ring main distribution system at NITC by the Kerala State Electricity Board. It was also recommended to approve the proposal of providing 50 cents of land at NITC Campus for setting up the substation and associated control /switching and charging station/ offices. This was to fulfill the power requirements of the National Institute of Technology (NIT) Calicut by providing uninterrupted and reliable electricity supply for ongoing and future projects, as well as to accommodate anticipated load growth. The work was entrusted as a deposit work to KSEBL.</p> <p>The sanction of the amount was based on the initial estimate provided by KSEB which was approximate. The proposed project involves the construction of a fully automated 33kV substation, which includes the installation of two 5 MVA 33/11 kV transformers with Ring Main Units (RMUs) and a 50-meter LILO (Line In Line Out) connection from the existing Agasthiamuzhi-Vellannur feeder. The installation of substation was proposed to be on a cost sharing basis. The committee also noted that, the estimate provided was approximate as a detailed final estimate had not been prepared at the time. This estimate was intended to support NITC in determining an approximate amount for their share.</p>

The cost estimation was based on the initial concept of a conventional manned substation. However, it is important to note that the cost of operating and maintaining a manned substation, with operators engaged round-the-clock, for an extended period would be substantial. In line with the government's and KSEBL's policy to minimize manpower, it has been decided to opt for an unmanned substation. The initial approximate cost for the conventional 33kV substation was Rs 4.4 crore, without considering the recurring expenses for operation and maintenance. The purpose of this estimate was solely to provide an input for the project cost. To eliminate the need for such recurring expenses, NITC proposed the implementation of an unmanned substation. Various additional provisions have been included for the unmanned substation, such as the installation of a Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) system in the 110kV Agasthyamuzhy substation, a Bay Control Protection Unit (BCPU) in the 11kV and 33kV indoor panels, two sets of Ring Main Unit CCC, and an optical fiber cable connecting both substations.

It was informed to the committee that in March 2023, KSEBL submitted a detailed cost estimate, along with a plan, amounting to approximately Rs. 796.23 lakhs. According to the aforementioned references, the NITC's share for the 33kV substation (50% of the estimate) is Rs. 398.115 lakhs, and the cost for the ring main cabling work under the deposit scheme is Rs. 280 lakhs. Subsequently, amount was deposited to KSEB for the substation in full (Rs. 398.115 lakhs) and for the ring main cabling work partially (Rs. 61.885 lakhs) from the already sanctioned amount of Rs. 460 lakhs. Now, to successfully complete the project, an additional sanction for Rs. 218.115 lakhs  $((398.115 + 280) - 460)$  is required.

The committee was informed that the execution of this project will enable NITC to meet its power requirements efficiently, ensure uninterrupted operations for ongoing and future projects, and accommodate the anticipated load growth.

The committee noted that the submission is for consideration and approval of the requested additional sanction for Rs. 218.115 lakhs for the successful implementation of this vital infrastructure project, which has already commenced after signing an agreement with KSEB.

<p><b>Subject</b> <b>FC.57.04</b></p>	<p><b>Approval of BWC Recommendation on Agenda Item 2023:02:14</b></p> <p><b>2023:02:14 Consideration of the proposal for inviting expression of interest for three infrastructure projects in the Institute on an urgent basis.</b></p>

<p><b>Decision</b></p>	<p>The committee noted that as proposed by the Institute Master Plan committee, it was decided to call expression of interest for three infrastructure projects on urgent basis. They are: (i) Building for Students Activity and Sports Centre (SAS Centre) (ii) Football stadium and athletic track in the 12th mile ground and (iii) Building connecting the two administrative buildings in the campus. There are limited sports facilities in the campus and there has been a rising demand over the years for improving the facilities. In one of the meetings of the Master Plan committee, the Competent Authority has instructed the Department of Architecture and Planning to plan and design a few sports facilities as earmarked by the committee in the campus for immediate implementation. Accordingly, the Department of Architecture has presented the conceptual design and approximate estimate for two projects namely (i) Building for Students Activity and Sports Centre (ii) Football stadium and athletic track in the 12th mile ground. The approximate estimate for these projects put together was Rs. 48.55 Cr. (42.8 Cr for SAS Centre + 5.75 Cr. for football stadium and athletic track). The proposal for a connecting building between the two administrative buildings of the Institute was presented in the BWC meeting held in December 2022 (Item 2022:02:12). The BWC recommended for the approval of the project in principle, but suggested suitable modifications in line with the observations in the BWTAC. It was suggested that the character of the buildings is to be retained when modifications are done, as they are iconic structures of the campus and the requirement of additional office space may also be considered in some alternate locations. Deputy Secretary, Dept. of Higher Education, MoE suggested that the proposal should be meticulously laid down indicating whether the connecting passages are required at different floor levels etc. Taking into consideration all the suggestions, the revised plan has been prepared by the Department of Architecture and Planning and presented before the Master Plan Committee. An amount of Rs. 437 Lakhs was sanctioned for the work in the BoG held on 05.12.2022. The estimate for the revised proposal will be well within the approved amount as the total built-up area is only 860.45 m<sup>2</sup> The committee noted that the three projects are of immediate requirement and are planned to be executed after calling Expression of Interest (EoI) on Design and Build terms, as per the conceptual design approved by the Master Plan committee. In order to reduce the duration of construction, steel</p>
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	<p>construction/pre-fab construction is proposed for consideration and inclusion in the structural components in these projects.</p> <p><i>The FC noted that the BWC deliberated the matter and recommended the proposal of calling Expression of Interest (EoI) for the execution of all the projects on ‘Design and Build’ basis as per the conceptual design approved by the Master Plan committee of the Institute. The proposal for steel construction/pre-fab construction in order to reduce the duration of construction was also recommended for approval. It was also recommended to meet the expenses of the project namely, Building for Students Activity and Sports Centre of Rs. 42.8 Cr. from the IRG of the Institute. The fund for the Football stadium and athletic track in the 12th mile ground for an amount 5.75 Cr may be sought from the Ministry of Education. The change in the design layout of the connecting building in line with the suggestions made by the earlier BWC/BoG was also recommended for approval</i></p> <p><i>FC has recommended the deliberations of the BWC with regard to meeting the expenses of INR 42.8 Cr for Sports Centre and Students Activity building from IRG. For other expenses to be made from OH-35, FC instructed to send a detailed proposal to Ministry.</i></p> <p><i>Based on the above, the FC recommended to the Hon’ble BoG for approval of the proposal for Building for Student’s Activity and Sports Centre.</i></p>
<p><b>Subject</b> FC.57.04</p>	<p><b>Approval of BWC Recommendation on Agenda Item 2023:02:15</b></p> <p><b>2023:02:15 Proposal for extension of time of completion for the works of SITC of 6 Nos. of lifts for Mega Hostel- I</b></p>
<p><b>Decision</b></p>	<p>The work of Supply Installation Testing and Commissioning (SITC) of six lifts for Mega Hostel -I was entrusted to M/s. Johnson Private Ltd. and the site was handed over on 15th December 2014 with time of completion as 150 days. It may be informed that the civil works of Mega Hostel-I was entrusted to M/S. Era Infra Engineering Ltd (EIEL) in 2009. Due to delay in work the 47th BoG held on 05.02.2019 had decided to terminated EIEL from the construction of Mega Hostel–I and to entrust the balance work to CPWD. The estimate for the</p>



	<p>balance work was submitted by CPWD and necessary approvals were given. Later, CPWD expressed unwillingness to take up the work. Hence it was decided to select a new executing agency by calling Expression of Interest. The estimate for the same is placed in this BWC for approvals. Looking at the current status of the work, two lifts had been erected by M/s. Johnson Private Ltd. and the equipment for the remaining four lifts had been supplied. Since the civil work was terminated, the remaining lifts can be erected only after rearranging the balance work and after completing the necessary civil work required for lift erection.</p> <p>In the BWC meeting held on 19.07.2022 the SITC of 6 No.s of lifts for Mega Hostel-I, was extended till 30-06-2023. As the time extension granted is going to end, M/s. Johnson Private Ltd. has requested for extension of time of completion up to 30-06-2024.</p> <p><i>The FC noted that the BWC deliberated the matter and recommended the proposal for extension of the time of completion for the works of SITC of 6 Nos. of lifts for Mega Hostel- I till 30-06-2024.</i></p> <p><i>Based on the above the FC recommended to the Hon'ble BoG for approval of the proposal.</i></p>
<p><b>Subject</b> <b>FC.57.04</b></p>	<p><b>Approval of BWC Recommendation on Agenda Item 2023:02:16</b></p> <p><b>2023:02:16 Reporting the progress of ongoing works entrusted to CPWD by CPWD officials.</b></p>
<p><b>Decision</b></p>	<p>The Executive Engineer, CPWD reported the status of the four works currently being executed by CPWD in the campus. They are: (i) Construction of Compound wall for a 700 metre stretch by the side of the main road separating the residential and academic areas (ii) Construction of the 5 lakh litre sump near the filter house (iii) Construction of the 5 lakh litre capacity overhead water tank near the Institute Guest House, and (iv) Construction of the drawing hall over the ECLC building in the East Campus. The EE, CPWD informed that the works (i), (ii) and (iii) are progressing well and for (iv), the Civil part of the work is completed but the Electrical work is yet to be completed. Chairman</p>

	<p>BWC requested the CPWD officials to expedite the works and hand them over to the Institute at the earliest.</p> <p><i>FC noted the progress of ongoing works entrusted to CPWD and the deliberations made by BWC in this regard.</i></p>
