Joint Secretary & Financial Adviser had enquired whether any such instructions from Ministry is available for raising the financial powers. In reply, Director intimated that the decision to increase the financial powers are taken in the Board of Governors.

The Board of Governors has approved the proposal recommended by Finance Committee to increase the financial powers to Head of the Departments to INR 2.5 lakhs along with the Chairpersons of Multidisciplinary Centres.

Registrar and Secretary to Board of Governors had detailed the Board that Institute follows the reservation norms in accordance with the Central Educational Institutions (Reservation in Teachers’ Cadre) Act, 2019 [Shortly “CEI (Reservation) Act 2019”]. Prior to the promulgation of CEI (Reservation) Act 2019, the Institute followed the reservation norms as per the Office Memorandum No.F.20-46/2003-TS-III dated 07.06.2004 issued by Ministry.

The Secretary to BoG had also apprised the Board that 131 faculty got recruited till December 2022 after the CIEI Act came into force. The category wise list of recruited faculties were also detailed to the Board. Hence, the total vacancies as on 30.06.2023 is 137 with the following distribution of vacancies across different categories:

Personal interviews were conducted for those candidates who reported in person and video conferencing interviews were conducted for the candidates, who were stationed abroad.</p> <p>The Board was informed that the constitution of Selection Committees for various departments/Schools was as per Statutes. The Board was also informed about the filling of Associate Professor as well as Professor posts in addition to Assistant Professor posts. 	Shri.Raveendran Kasthuri, H'ble Member -BoG has raised whether any issue is still pending with regard to Non-teaching staff pay fixation.

In reply, Registrar and Secretary to BoG had briefed on the issue and detailed the Board about the recent instructions from the Ministry to recover the excess paid arrears to the Non-teaching staff. Registrar informed the Board that the recovery instructions from Ministry is based on the audit para from CAG. Registrar also informed that BoG that no other issue is pending apart from the instructions to recover the excess paid arrears from the non-teaching staff.

Dr.Manu,, one of the members of the Board has opined that applicable DOPT OM's may be considered before imposing the recovery so that eligible protection may be given to the non-teaching staff in this regard.

In reply, Registrar and Secretary to BoG has apprised the Board that DOPT OMs are not directly applicable to Central Autonomous bodies. Board of Governors has to take cases by case approach. Registrar has also informed that no pay revision has been denied to the non-teaching staff of the Institute. Registrar has informed the Board that during the year 2020 only the 7th CPC pay has been fixed for the Institute non-teaching staff. Registrar and Secretary to BoG has assured the Board of be informed about the Non-teaching staff issues and a concrete recommendation of recovery will be placed in the next BoG meeting.

BoG noted the brief given by the Registrar and Secretary to BoG in this regard.

There being no further points, the meeting was concluded at 05.00 pm with a proposal to thank the Chair.

Although the Institute and colleagues are putting in best efforts to mitigate the hardships to the unfortunate individuals, seldom it has been observed that the need is completely or satisfactorily fulfilled. The absence of a self- sustaining Institute fund has been felt and efforts are being made now to institute a fund for welfare purposes of the staff and their family members. The Students are supported through Students welfare fund at the Institute and Hostels and covers student’s requirements to a large extent.</p> <p>The key parameters of the Fund are as follows:-</p> <p>Utilization of the Fund. The fund shall be utilized for the following purposes, within the defined financial limits:-</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (a) Contribution towards common insurance, health policy/ies. (b) Conduct of programmes of health camps, promoting mental health, medical check up, Yoga, wellness activities and related activities (c) Ex-gratia payments towards serious illness of staff and their family members. (d) Ex-gratia payments towards unfortunate death of the staff.

- (e) Ex-gratia payments towards the shifting of the deceased, conduct funeral/ last rites etc.
- (f) Payments towards welfare activities, scholarships etc to Staff and their family members.
- (g) Other payments as approved by the Management Committee.

Management Committee. This fund shall be administered by an Institute Management Committee comprising the Director (Chairperson), Dy Director, Registrar, Dean(FW), Staff representatives from Faculty, Group A, Group B and Group C with DR or AR handling the Finance and Accounts as Member Secretary.

The Source of Fund. An initial grant of Rs 2 Crore from IRG will act as seed money and will be kept as FD. The source of Funds will be :-

- (a) Interest earned from the seed grant.
- (b) Monthly contributions from the Staff collected through the salary component.
- (c) Govt grants for welfare activities.
- (d) 0.5% of IRG revenue of the Institute in the previous year (Rs 5 for every Rs 1000 earned in IRG).
- (e) Any donations by the staff, alumni, banks, organizations, CSR funds etc.

Financial Limits. Various financial limits towards ex-gratia, other assistance, scholarships etc shall be decided by the Management Committee based on the income, anticipated expenditure and other circumstances

It is proposed to obtain income tax exemption for NITC Benevolent Fund under section 80G.

The detailed orders(bye-laws) for the same shall be prepared and reported to the BoG.

The BoG deliberated on the issues of necessity of such a fund, recent incidents occurring in the institute, various CGHS schemes available, strength and growth of the Institute, funds requirement, contribution from the staff etc

After detailed deliberation, *the following were approved by the BoG:-*

- 1. The NITC Benevolent Fund to be initiated with Rs 2 Crore seed money from the IRG. The interest generated shall act as source of funds*
- 2. The detailed Bye-laws to be drafted as a proposal and reported to the BoG.*
- 3. There shall be contribution to this Fund by the regular staff of the Institute. One time opportunity may be given to the existing staff to opt out of the Fund.*

	<p><i>Any staff opting out of contribution are not eligible for any financial support or other benefits or schemes through this fund.</i></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <i>4. The financial benefits extended to members is envisaged to cover complete expenses they may borne but shall be restricted to an amount decided by the management committee depending on the funds accrued.</i> <i>5. The maximum financial assistance through this fund along with other eligible CGHS, institute insurance policy, any central/state Govt aid etc is to be restricted to the expenditures actually incurred by the claimant staff.</i> <i>6. A good measure of welfare, health, wellness activities for the staff and family members may be planned by the management committee.</i> <i>7. The decision of the Chairperson of the Management committee (Director) in any related matter is final and binding and bye law shall provide suitable clause for the same.</i>

Therefore, in principle approval was sought to search, survey, visit, identify suitable land/buildings on hire, lease or outright purchase to expand the campus and/or set up the satellite campus/s in Kozhikode, Kochi and Thiruvananthapuram.</p> <p>The BoG deliberated in detail about the land availability, increase in students’ strength, staff strength and foreseeable future requirements. The BoG acknowledged that there is requirement of additional land, buildings and other infrastructure for the Institute to meet the demands.</p>

The Institute should request the State Govt to allot additional land for development of present campus and to develop satellite campus.</i> <i>2. This would enable closure of pending court cases and avoid contempt of the court.

(b) Permission to amend the clauses in service agreement of incumbent Registrar accordingly and implement the same with the permission of the Chairman BoG.

(c) Continue to pay provisional pay for further period of 3 months and not beyond May 2023.

After detailed discussion the BoG has decided the following

Since, the incumbent Registrar's pay and allowances are also involved with the matter, the BoG allowed current Registrar and Secretary BoG to recuse from the further discussions.

The BoG did not accept the proposal to empower the Director to arrive at the decisions in the matter of Lt Col Pankajakshan cases. Further BoG recommended the following :-

- ***The Gratuity is applicable only to employees with more than five years' service in an organization.***
- ***For contract employees, EPF scheme is applicable (NPS is not applicable). EPF employer's contribution can be limited to that corresponding to wages of Rs 15000 per month.***
- ***Pay protection is applicable only to those who join under deputation (not for contract).***
- ***Earned leave encashment is governed by order No. 14028/1/2017 (estt(1) issued by Ministry of Personal Public Grievance and Pensions, Department of Personnel & Training dated 27/06/2017 that it is clarified that persons re-employed after retirement may be governed by Rule 39(6)(a)(iii) of the CCS (leave) 1972 and said they may be granted leave encashment up to a maximum of 300 days including the period for which encashment was allowed at the time of retirement.***

It was also decided that as there is a potential conflict of interest, the current Registrar must not handle the file regarding the payments due from the former Registrar Lt. Col. Pankajakshan (Retd).

A Committee with Director NITC as Chairperson and full-time Registrars of two other NITs as members will look into the audit observations and finalise the financial liabilities to/from the former Registrar Lt. Col. Pankajakshan (Retd).

In case of pay, allowances and service conditions of the current Registrar Cdr(Dr) Shamasundara, the BoG requested the Director as follows:-

On enquiry, M/s.MVR Cancer Centre and Research Institute has informed that the official has been diagnosed to have multiple myeloma and is being planned for chemotherapy with the administration of life saving drugs. The approximate cost for administering such drugs as provided by the hospital is Rs.18 lakhs and the official will be reassessed thereafter for further treatment.</p> <p>It was brought out that as per delegation of powers in the CGHS scheme for settlement of medical reimbursement / grant of medical advances, claims exceeding Rs.5 lakhs (worked out as per rate list) are to be approved by the Department of Consultation with the Internal Finance Division.</p> <p>The BoG further informed that as an interim arrangement, the official has been sanctioned Rs.2 lakhs as medical advance.</p> <p><i>The BoG considered the recommendation of FC and approved the expenditure on medical treatment as per CGHS entitlement.</i></p>

Kitchen Equipment rectification in Mega Hostel II: The kitchen equipment installation has been completed and the defects reported by the NITC is being looked into.

BoG noted that in reply to the above presentation, the Director has pointed out that the Academic Block sanctioned under the EWS Scheme of the MoE is a Project of top priority and the progress of the same is being closely monitored by the MoE. The CPWD was awarded the work in 2019 and the first instalment of Rs. 7.44 Crores was deposited to the CPWD in March 2022. But even after a period of 4 years, and after a period of one year of crediting an amount of Rs. 7.44 Crores, the work has not been tendered as on today. In spite of the issues reported by the CPWD, the Institute is facing severe shortage of Academic space and the Institute is facing difficulty in answering the queries from the MoE related to the progress of the work and is receiving critical comments from the Audit for unnecessarily parking huge amount without any outcome.

The BoG further noted that, on this issue, the Member from the MoE pointed out that it is not mandatory that the works are to be entrusted with the CPWD and the Institute has the liberty to award the work to any other Public Agency. Supporting this view, the Member from MoE opined in view of the fact that the CPWD has failed to even start the execution of the Project, the Institute can demand the CPWD to return the amount of Rs. 7.44 Crores to the Institute. The Committee therefore decided to take appropriate steps to request the CPWD to return the amount of Rs. 7.44

	<p>Crores to the Institute. It was also decided initiate steps to execute the work by inviting Expression of Interest from appropriate agencies. On the remarks of the works related to the OAT, the Dean (P&D) informed that the CPWD was communicated by the Institute in February 2022 that the Electrical drawings prepared by the Agency (to whom the work was awarded by the CPWD) was not acceptable and hence the Electrical work has to be put on hold and that the CPWD was requested to inform the formalities involved in changing the scope of the electrical and lighting contract awarded. Hence the statement that the Electrical work is pending approval from the NITC is not factual. Regarding the Compound Wall work, the Dean (P&D) informed that there was no delay in giving permission for removing the trees along the compound wall. On the issue of rectification of Kitchen Equipment in the Mega Hostel II, the Director has commented that the even after occupying the Mega Hostel II, the Kitchen could not be used on account of the sub-standard work executed by the Contractor who was engaged by the CPWD. And it was also informed that the CPWD did not monitor the quality of the equipment and the Contractor was paid the entire contract amount pending only the Security Deposit. New Delhi, the 02nd June 2023

F. No. _____(E).—In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (2) of section 26 of the National Institutes of Technology, Science Education and Research Act, 2007 (29 of 2007), with the approval of the Visitor of the National Institute of Technology Calicut, the Board of the National Institute of Technology Calicut, hereby makes the following Statutes to amend the First Statutes of the National Institutes of Technology, namely:—

1. (1) These Statutes may be called the First Statutes of the National Institutes of Technology (Amendment) Statutes, 2023.

(2) They shall apply to the National Institute of Technology Calicut.

(3) They shall come into force on the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.

2. In the First Statutes of the National Institutes of Technology (hereinafter referred to as the principal Statutes), in statute 1, in sub-statute (1), for the words “The First Statutes of the National Institutes of Technology”, the words and figures “the National Institute of Technology Calicut Statutes, 2017” shall be substituted.

3. Throughout the principal Statutes, for the words “Ministry of Human Resource Development”, wherever they occur, the words “Ministry of Education” shall be substituted.

4. In the principal Statutes, in statute 23,—

(a) in sub-statute (5), in the opening portion, the words “or by promotion” shall be omitted;

(b) for sub-statute (12), the following sub-statute shall be substituted, namely:—

“(12) Some of the posts may be exempted from the purview of the personal interview for selection, which may be decided by the Board and in case where the interview is compulsory, the Selection Committee shall examine credentials of all the candidates who have been called for interview, interview the eligible candidates and recommend the names of suitable candidates to the competent authority for approval and appointment thereafter.”.

5. In the principal Statutes, in Schedule ‘E’,—

(a) against serial number 1, for entries in column (2), the following entries shall be substituted, namely:—

“Assistant Professor, Grade – II (to be appointed on contract basis) in Level-10 of the Pay Matrix of the 7th Central Pay Commission or any other corresponding pay scale or pay level approved by the Central Government or the Council, as the case may be.”;

(b) against serial number 2, for entries in column (2), the following entries shall be substituted, namely:—

“Assistant Professor, Grade–II (to be appointed on contract basis) in Level-11 of the Pay Matrix of the 7th Central Pay Commission or any other corresponding pay scale or pay level approved by the Central Government or the Council, as the case may be.”;

(c) against serial number 3,—

(i) for entries in column (2), the following entries shall be substituted, namely:—

“Assistant Professor, Grade–I in Level-12 of the Pay Matrix of the 7th Central Pay Commission or any other corresponding pay scale or pay level approved by the Central Government or the Council, as the case may be.”;

(ii) in column (4), for the words “reputed academic Institute”, the words “Institution of repute” shall be substituted;

(d) against serial number 4,—

(i) for entries in column (2), the following entries shall be substituted, namely:—

“Associate Professor in Level-13A2 of the Pay Matrix of the 7th Central Pay Commission or any other corresponding pay scale or pay level approved by the Central Government or the Council, as the case may be.”;

- (ii) for entries in column (4), the following entries shall be substituted, namely:—
“Six years after Ph.D. of which at least three years experience at the level of Assistant Professor Grade-I in Level-12 of the Pay Matrix of the 7th Central Pay Commission or any other corresponding pay scale or pay level approved by the Central Government or the Council, as the case may be; or nine years total working experience, of which three years shall be after Ph.D. and with three years experience at the level of Assistant Professor Grade-I in Level-12 of the Pay Matrix of the 7th Central Pay Commission or any other corresponding pay scale or pay level approved by the Central Government or the Council, as the case may be.”;
- (e) against serial number 5, —
- (i) for entries in column (2), the following entries shall be substituted, namely:—
“Professor in Level-14A of the Pay Matrix of the 7th Central Pay Commission or any other corresponding pay scale or pay level approved by the Central Government or the Council, as the case may be.”;
- (ii) for entries in column (4), the following entries shall be substituted, namely:—
“Ten years after Ph.D. or thirteen years total working experience, out of which seven years shall be after Ph.D. and with three years experience at the level of Associate Professor in Level-13A2 of the Pay Matrix of the 7th Central Pay Commission or four years at the level of Associate Professor in Level-13A1 or combination of Level-13A1 and Level-13A2 or equivalent in an Institution of repute or Research and Development lab or relevant industry.”;
- (f) against serial number 6,—
- (i) for entries in column (2), the following entries shall be substituted, namely:—
“Professor (Higher Administrative Grade) in Level-15 of the Pay Matrix of the 7th Central Pay Commission or any other corresponding pay scale or pay level approved by the Central Government or the Council, as the case may be.”;

(ii) for entries in column (4), the following entries shall be substituted, namely:—

“Six years as Professor in Level 14 or equivalent or Level 14A or equivalent or a combination of service in Level 14 and Level 14A in an Institute of National Importance:

Provided that upto a maximum of 40% of the total number of Professors in position, after rendering regular service of six years as Professor may be granted Higher Administrative Grade scale after fulfilling the eligibility conditions and on the recommendations of duly constituted Selection Committee.”;

(g) in Note 1,—

(I) for paragraph (1), the following shall be substituted, namely:—

“(1) Any change in the pay scale shall be through an open advertisement and on the recommendations of the duly constituted Selection Committee, except where specifically exempted in these Statutes:

Provided that the Assistant Professor Grade–II appointed on contract basis in the Institute shall be, on successful completion of one year of service in Level-10 of the Pay Matrix of the 7th Central Pay Commission, may be upgraded to Level-11 of the Pay Matrix of the 7th Central Pay Commission or any other corresponding pay scale or grade pay or pay level, if found suitable by a duly constituted Selection Committee, but not through open advertisement.”;

(II) in paragraph (6), for sub-paragraph (a), the following sub-paragraph shall be substituted, namely:—

“(a) Permanent faculty with fifty years of age or above—

(i) The Assistant Professors Grade–II in Level-11 of the Pay Matrix of the 7th Central Pay Commission shall be mapped at the level of Assistant Professor Grade–I in Level-12 of the Pay Matrix of the 7th Central Pay Commission or any other corresponding pay scale or grade pay or pay level approved by the Central Government or the Council, provided that they have at least 10 credit points in their service.

(ii) The Assistant Professors Grade-I in Level-12 of the Pay Matrix of the 7th Central Pay Commission shall be mapped at the level of Associate Professor in Level-13A2 of the Pay Matrix of the 7th Central Pay Commission, provided they have at least 25 credit points in their service.

(iii) The Associate Professors in Level-13A1 of the Pay Matrix of the 7th Central Pay Commission shall be mapped at the level of Associate Professor in Level-13A2 of the Pay Matrix of the 7th Central Pay Commission, provided that they have at least 25 credit points in their service:

Provided that they have been found suitable through a Selection Committee duly constituted under the Statutes.”;

(III) for paragraph (7), the following paragraphs shall be substituted, namely:—

“(7) For faculty in the Department of Architecture, following shall be essential qualifications without insisting on credit point requirements at Assistant Professor level:

- (i) M.Arch. or M.Plan. with one-year professional experience: Assistant Professor Grade-II in Level-10 of the Pay Matrix of the 7th Central Pay Commission or any other corresponding pay scale or grade pay or pay level approved by the Central Government or the Council, as the case may be;
- (ii) M.Arch. or M.Plan. with two years of professional experience: Assistant Professor Grade-II in Level-11 of the Pay Matrix of the 7th Central Pay Commission or any other corresponding pay scale or grade pay or pay level approved by the Central Government or the Council, as the case may be.

(8) The qualifications and other terms and conditions of appointment of academic staff as specified under Schedule ‘E’ shall be read in conjunction with the guidelines or clarifications issued with the approval of the Council on 13th September, 2017; 30th

November, 2017; 4th December, 2017; 31st January, 2018; 20th April, 2018; and 16th April, 2019.

(9) The one-time relaxation or measures for the then stagnated and eligible faculty of the National Institute of Technology Calicut shall be as per the relaxations issued with the approval of the Council *vide* communications dated the 6th October, 2017 and 17th November, 2017:

Provided that one-time relaxation or measures contained in the communications dated the 6th October, 2017 and 17th November, 2017 shall have no validity and stand exhausted after the first round of recruitments initiated after issuance of those one-time relaxations or measures and shall not have any validity for subsequent rounds of recruitment of the faculty in the National Institute of Technology Calicut.”.

- (h) in Note 2, for the words “since the last promotion” wherever they occur, the words “since the last appointment” shall be substituted.
