The Secretary welcomed the members present to the 66th meeting of the Senate of the National Institute of Technology Calicut and the Chairman called the meeting to order at 3.30 P.M.



S.66.1: Passing of the Minutes of the 65th meeting of Senate

Senate resolved to approve the minutes of the 65th meeting of the Senate held on July 09, 2018.

S.66.2: Recommendation of the 65th Meeting of the Senate S. 66.2.1 to S.66.2.2 (Agenda)

S.66.2.1 Consideration for extension of maximum duration of B.Tech and BArch Programmes – Representation from students of 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012 and 2013 admissions – Report of the Committee constituted

Upon detailed deliberations, the Senate resolved to approve the recommendations of the committee given as follows:

- Permit the students to register for all remaining courses within the limits of permissible overload without discontinuation, attend the classes, obtain attendance grade of N or H. Afterwards allow them to appear for end semester exams till the student clears the subject. The internal marks scored by the student along with marks in end semester exam will be considered for award of grade in a subject. However, the student has to satisfy credit and other requirements to register for courses of a particular level. This is suggested for the following reasons.
 1. Students can acquire the credits at their own pace and complete the requirements for the award of the degree.
 2. Once a student gets attendance grade of ‘N’ or ‘H’ in a course, the student is not required to register for that course in a regular semester and attend the classes. So there will not be any problem of large number of students in a class.
 3. Since such students do not have to register in a regular semester, they need not be permitted to stay in hostels.
 4. However, this will require the departments/Institute to keep track of such students and their internal marks till they complete B.Tech. programme or their registration gets cancelled.

S.66.2.2: Consideration of the report of the inducted Committee constituted by 65th senate meeting to review the clauses regarding probation and other related rules of B.Tech/ B.Arch Programmes

Upon detailed deliberations, the Senate resolved to approve the recommendations of the committee in principle and the major points on the revision of the Ordinances and regulations (for B. Tech / B.Arch 2017 admission onwards) are as follows:

- R.8.1. A student admitted to B Tech programme in the first semester can continue up to 8th semester, in the ascending order, subject to the conditions that he/she shall become eligible for registration to (i) 3rd semester only on earning 15 credits, (ii) 5th semester only on earning 40 credits, (iii) 7th semester only on crediting all 1st level courses and earning 65 credits as per the relevant curriculum.
A student admitted to B Arch programme in the first semester can continue up to 10th semester, in the ascending order, subject to the conditions that he/she shall become eligible for registration to (i) 3rd semester only on earning 15 credits, (ii) 5th semester only on earning 40 credits, (iii) 7th semester only on crediting all 1st level courses and earning 70 credits and (iv) 9th semester only on crediting all 1st and 2nd level courses and earning 90 credits as per the relevant curriculum.



When a student fails to satisfy the above mentioned stipulations at any stage, he/she has to discontinue the programme and leave the campus.

- R.9.1 The minimum duration of the B.Tech. programme shall be 4 years. However, a student may complete the programme at a slower pace by taking more time, but in any case not more than 8 years.
- R.9.2 The minimum duration of the B.Arch. programme shall be 5 years. However, a student may complete the programme at a slower pace by taking more time, but in any case not more than 10 years.
- R.22.3b A student with F grade in a course with attendance grade N or H will be allowed to appear for make-up examination for 50 marks, to which the marks obtained for the continuous evaluation will be added. If the student still gets an F in the course the student will be offered a remedial class for the course for one-month duration during summer. The evaluation for the remedial course will be out of 50 marks to which the marks obtained for the continuous evaluation will be added and the student will be awarded E or R or F grade ONLY. If the student gets an F in the course even after the remedial class, the student will be allowed to continue the programme as per 8.1 and will be asked to re-register for the course if desired or can attend the remedial class and appear for the remedial examination during the next summer.
But, a student with F grade in an elective course may appear for the remedial class if he/she desires so or register for a new elective course as a replacement course on the advice of FA.
- R.24.2 Class/Division Classification is based on CGPA and is as follows:
CGPA 8 and above: **First Class with Distinction**
CGPA 6.5 and above, but less than 8: **First Class**
CGPA 5 and above, but less than 6.5: **Second Class**
CGPA 4 and above, but less than 5: **Third Class**

R.9.1, R.9.2 and R.24.2 are applicable to B. Tech / B.Arch 2013 admission onwards also.

The committee is also requested to submit policies to address the implementation issues for conducting the remedial classes.
